Distance Learning Provides a quality education for people who lead busy lives and desire to start or continue pursing their educational goals. Distance Learning courses are just like traditional on-campus classes. You take your courses with a group of other students.

Our distance learning Courses are the same university-transferable, community college courses taught on-site at Taft College. Enrollment is limited to the same number of students as on-site courses, usually 35 students, depending on the course. Each is available on a first come-first serve basis. Matriculated student get priority registration.

Taft College offers two types of Distance Learning courses: Distance Learning offline and Distance Learning Online. Each is designed to facilitate your learning experience with the special advantages that Distance Learning Offers:

- More Individualized Instruction
- · Fitting college into your busy schedule
- Easy access to your instructors through e-mail and voice mail
- A multimedia approach to learning

Online learning is not for everyone, however; we've found successful online learners tend to be self-.motivated and self-disciplined.

Taft College Canvas Courses: Canvas is a new Course Management System (CMS) that Taft College is using for Face to Face and Distance Learning Courses. Canvas is used to house Distance Learning courses in similar ways as our previous CMS's, Etudes and Moodle.

All Distance Learning Courses will be in Canvas. If you cannot locate your Canvas Account, courses, or have trouble logging into Canvas please call the Distance Ed Help Desk.

How to Log in:

Username will be your A# with a capital 'A'.

Password will be the first letters from your first and last name and the last 6 numbers of your student ID# (No spaces, First letter capitalized).




- You will need to begin classes promptly. NO ONE WILL CONTACT YOU!

Helpful Hints When Taking Online Courses

- ⇒Start your class promptly. NO ONE WILL CONTACT YOU AND MAKE YOU START YOUR CLASS.
- ⇒Course notifications and announcements will go to your most recent email address given to TC.

 Make sure your email information is up to date with the college. Also, check your junk box to make sure you didn't miss important course notifications.
- ⇒Students **who do not** check in during the **first few days of class** are **often dropped**. This will not relieve you of your financial responsibility. There is also no guarantee that you will be placed back in the course.
- ⇒If you do not wish to stay in the class AND you want a refund, you will need to drop the class within the specified drop dates. For drop dates call the counseling center.
- ⇒You will not be able to see your course on Canvas until it begins. If you have any questions, contact your instructor or the Distance Learning Help Desk ASAP.
- ⇒If you are added to an online course, you will be able to access it the following day.



DSPS

DSPS provides support services and accommodations to students with disabilities so they can participate as fully and equitably from the college experience as their non-disabled peers.

CalWORKs

CalWORKs funds are for the purpose of assisting welfare recipient students and those in transition off of welfare to achieve long term self-sufficiency through coordinated student services offered at community colleges including: work study, job placement, child care, coordination, curriculum development and redesign, and under certain conditions post-employment skills training, and instructional services.

EOPS/CARE
