

How to see your similarity report:

- 1. Go into the assignment, it should look like Figure A
- 2. When you see a similarity %, click on the icon to get to the full Similarity Report. The Feedback Studio will open your Similarity Report. Your instructor will let you know what % score is acceptable for a submission.
- 3. Review each LAYER of the Similarity Report: Instructor comments, Possible Plagiarism, and Grammar Errors. Figure B
- 4. Make revisions to your work as necessary. The grammar checker will help point out things that need to be corrected. See page 2 for detailed instructions on using feedback studio.
- 5. Resubmit your edited assignment.



Layers consist of:

- Instructor comments comments made by your professor. Pay attention to these. They are really important.
- Possible Plagiarism- Areas in need of attention/revision. Click on each one to see where it originated (came from). You may simply need to adjust the way you cited a quote, or you may need to reach out to your instructor for more help.
- Grammar Errors- also need to be revised. Click on each one for more details on how to address it.

You can review one layer at a time or see everything at once.


Depending on how your teacher uses feed-back, here are some places you can look:

1. Click on the Red number associated with plagiarism to see how you can fix citation in these areas.




