

Getting Started with Pope Tech

Get familiar with Accessibility in Canvas



Use the Pope Tech tool in your Canvas courses and consider accessibility design when building or editing your online content. Doing so would improve inclusiveness and provide access to the information provided online to all consumers both with or without disabilities.



Pope Tech is an LTI that is used within Canvas to help identify, fix, and track accessibility in Canvas courses

Pope Tech has available two different tools used within Canvas.

- Accessibility Guide get immediate feedback: error notes, alerts, and suggestions to fix the issue
- The Pope Tech Dashboard reviews, a specific course, all courses, or report options

Let's Get to Know the Enterprise PT Dashboard

Access the Enterprise PT Dashboard by:

- 1. Clicking the Pope Tech Accessibility Tab from the course navigation list.
- 2. Select one of three review options: (See Below)
- Course Dashboard: cover/s only that one specific course.
- My Dashboard: cover/s all the courses you're assigned an instructor in. You can review the overview option or drill down for detailed information.
- Reports: by course, format, type, and date parameters.


<u>The Course Dashboard</u> & <u>My Dashboard</u> option covers same areas of need, but at different scales.

- * **Overview for Issues:** in this area you will notice the error, contrast, and alerts issues being counted.
- * Most Common Issues: The issues will be categorical by errors and alerts. You will also have different information display options.
- * **Documents and Videos:** this will alert PDF's or links to check.
- * Content Blocks: review scans/not scans and drill down results by specific need. You can edit in this area also by selecting edit and opening up the accessibility guide.

Reviewing and Running **Reports**. Filter your reports by areas of criteria.

- * Choose the specific course to review
- * Choose the type of query results
- * Choose the type of reporting your looking for
- * Set the date to run from and to

You can also, set your reports to run reoccurring if needed. Likewise, you will have an report archive area to review to monitor your trends and progress.



The Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) defines requirements for designers and developers to improve accessibility for people with disabilities. It defines three levels of conformance: Level A, Level AA, and Level AAA.



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
