AP 4227 Repeatable Courses

Title 5 Sections 55041, 55042, 55253

Under special circumstances, students may repeat courses in which a 'C' or better grade was earned.

- 1. Certain activity, performance and skill courses have been designated as repeatable courses and are identified in the college's course descriptions.
- 2. A student may repeat a course where substandard work has not been recorded when repetition is necessary for a student to meet a legally mandated training requirement as a condition of continued paid or volunteer employment. The student must certify or document that course repetition is necessary to complete legally mandated training.
- 3. A student who has been identified by the district as possessing a disability may repeat special learning skills classes, with permission from the instructor(s), and number of times under the following circumstances:
 - a. When continuing success of the student in other general and/or special education classes is dependent on additional repetitions of a specific special class.
 - b. When additional repetitions of a specific special class are essential to completing a student's preparation for enrollment into other regular or special classes.
 - c. When the student has a student educational contract that involves a goal other than completion of the special class in question and repetition of the course will further the achievement of the goal.
