Request for Approval – Resolution No. 2021/22-05 – COVID Vaccination Requirment for Faculty and Staff

Dr. Daniels stated that the presidential order mandates employers with 100+ employees to require proof of vaccine or to test employees. Measures are being taken to prepare for testing as long as feasible or necessary. Secretary Long noted he is not in agreement with the vaccine mandate but will support the option to test. On a motion by Secretary Long, seconded by Trustee Orrin and unanimously carried, the resolution was approved (copy attached to official minutes).

First Reading – MOU Between TCFA/CTA/NEA and WKCCD – Compensation Increase of 3.07% to Faculty Schedule (No Action)

Dr. Daniels said that in alignment with the bargained process there is a recommended compensation increase of 3.07% to bring the faculty salary to the Frey Report standard. It is to be noted that 2.75% is deemed COLA and the remainder is the salary increase itself.

The parties have agreed to revise Article 6.9, Campus Security Video Monitoring and Surveillance Technology, to the current collective bargaining agreement to read as follows:

6.9 <u>Security Video Monitoring and Surveillance Technology</u>: Video monitoring will not be used to view or record workstations, including private offices, desks or cubicles, classrooms, or roomswhere students, staff and/or faculty commonly work, study, or hold discussions, living areas, or other common-use areas where a reasonable expectation of privacy exists.

Video and access control security records will not be used for purposes related to the evaluation of employee job performance, nor will they be used as a means to track employee attendance and/or as a timekeeping record. However, the District may use such records in support of disciplinary proceedings against faculty, staff, or student(s), in a civil suit against person(s) whose activities are shown on the recording and are the basis for the suit. The Director of Campus Security or an authorized District administrator shall only perform review of video records, with a good faith reason for review.

Security cameras will not be monitored in real time with the exception of those located in the Campus Safety and Security office; as an immediate response to the report of criminal activity on campus; suspicious behavior or in the course of an ongoing investigation of criminal activity.Cameras shall only be reviewed and monitored by the Director of Campus Security or an authorized District administrator with a good faith reason for the review, with the following exceptions:

- <u>1. Bookstore public retail areas may be monitored in real time by Bookstore employees;</u>
- 2. Cougar Café food service areas may be monitored in real time by Café employees;

3. Child Development Center classrooms may be observed in real time as an instructional activity in alignment with Early Childhood Education curriculum under the direction and supervision of appropriate faculty and/or Child Development Center staff.

Information obtained in violation of the District's campus security camera policy may not be used in a disciplinary proceeding (with the exception of alleged criminal activity) against a faculty member. It is not the intent of the policy to use security cameras for the monitoring of faculty or employees for disciplinary purposes, performance evaluations, or corrective action.

The District will provide a 10-day written notice to the President and Vice-President of the Faculty Association of proposed installation of new cameras. 

Acknowledgement

The use of School District facilities shall be determined, in part, based upon availability and priority order. The priority order for usage is as follows:

1. School District activities

2. Student Body activities

3. Other Public Entity activities

4. Non-Profit Organization activities

5. Community activities

6. For-Profit Business activities

Pursuant to the Civic Center Act, the use of school buildings, grounds and equipment shall be granted, when an alternative location is not available, to non-profit organization and clubs or associations organized to promote youth and school activities, including but not limited to: Girl/Boy Scouts, Campfire Girls, Parent-Teacher Associations and School Community Advisory Councils. Such permissive use shall not apply to any group that uses school facilities or grounds for fundraising activities that are not beneficial to youth or public school activities, as determined by the governing board. All other users may be granted use of the facility if the purpose is for public, literary, scientific, recreational, educational or public agency meetings.

FACILITY USERS holding functions or meetings where admission fees are charged or contributions are solicited and the net receipts are not expended for the welfare of the pupils of the School District or for charitable purposes shall be charged by the School District an amount equal to fair rental value of the property.

School facilities or grounds shall not be used for any of the following activities:

1) Any use by an individual or group for the commission of any crime or any act prohibited by law,

2) Any use which is inconsistent with the use of the school facilities for school purposes or which interferes with the regular conduct of school or school work;

3) Any use which involves the possession, consumption, or sale of alcoholic beverages or any restricted substances, including tobacco (cf. 3513.3 - Tobacco - Free Schools). The district may exclude certain school facilities from non-school use for safety or security reasons. The district reserves the right to restrict and/or disallow any and all non-school-sponosred events for any reason allowed by law, statute, or applicable code. Unless otherwise noted, the use of alcohol, tobacco (smoked or smokeless), or any other drug and/or intoxicant not prescribed by a medical doctor to the user is expressly prohibited.

Damage and Liability

Groups, organizations, or persons using school facilities or grounds shall be liable for any property damage caused by the activity. The district may charge the amount necessary to repair the damages and may deny the group further use of school facilities or grounds (Education Code 38134). Any group or organization using school facilities or grounds shall be liable for any injuries resulting from its negligence during the use of district facilities or grounds. The group shall bear the cost of insuring against this risk and defending itself against claims arising from this risk. (Education Code 38134). Groups or organizations shall provide the district with evidence of insurance against claims arising out of the group's own negligence when using school facilities. (Education Code 38134). The applicant organization shall be responsible for the proper surveillance and supervision of all attendees. Adequate adult supervision is required and the adequacy thereof is at the sole discretion of the District.

Fire and Safety Regulations

1 At no time shall there be more people admitted to the facility or any room thereof than the legal seating capacity allows.

2. No Flammable decorations shall be used unless flame resistant or flame proof in accordance with the State Health and Safety Codes.

3. No device that produces flame, spark, smoke or explosion (including fireworks) shall be used on the premises without prior written approval.

Transferability

Any approved facilities use granted by the District is not transferrable to any other organization, entity or otherwise.

COVID-19 Notice & Requirements

Consideration and approval for facilities use requests are contingent upon the submission of a written COVID-19 Safety & Mitigation Plan to the District, as well as upon the California Department of Public Health/CalOSHA guidelines permitting such activities.

Recitals

1. District desires to obtain the services of a consultant especially trained and experienced in rendering the following services:

Professional development and leadership training for management and leaders in an institution.

(and as may be more particularly described in paragraph 3 of terms below).

2. Independent Contractor is an Independent Contractor especially trained and experienced in providing the services described in recital #1 above.

3. The parties have agreed that the Independent Contractor will provide the personal professional services of <u>**Professional Development**</u> (name) as specified in this Agreement as an Independent Contractor, as available, and not as an employee of the District.

Terms

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. **Recitals Approved.** The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. **Terms of Agreement.** Independent Contractor shall provide the services in the form of **up to four (4) days/sessions**.

9. **Standards of Ethical Conduct and Confidentiality**. Standards of ethical conduct and confidentiality shall be maintained, and Independent Contractor will not engage in inappropriate contacts or professional conflicts of interest.

THE BEARD FAMILY TRUST, dated October 30th, 2021("Landlord") herby rents to WEST KERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, 29 Cougar Ct. Taft CA 93268 ("Tenant") and Tenant hereby rent the following premises from Landlord, as-is:

The buildings, improvements, and parking lot located at 809 Black Gold CT. Taft Calif. 93268, consisting of [two buildings one is 4800 sq ft in size the other is 900 sq ft in size], in addition to a noncontiguous parcel of land located 809 Blackgold Ct Taft CA 93268 and consisting of [one lot at 15317.61 sq ft] (collectively, the "Premises"). - 5. Tenant agrees: To obey all applicable Federal, State, County and Municipal laws, regulations, rules and ordinances in regards to its occupancy and use of the Premises, and to maintain the Premises in accordance with same as of the date of this Lease. Tenant shall save the Landlord and hold it harmless from any expense, loss or damage to the Premises by reason of Tenant's violation of such laws, regulations, rules and ordinances as of the date of this Lease, or by reason of any damage to the Premises that is sustained by reason of the Tenant's negligence.
- 6. Tenant shall take care that no damage occurs to the buildings or any fixtures upon the Premises as a result of Tenant's use of the Premises, and Tenant shall be liable for all damages to the Premises caused by Tenant or its agents. Tenant agrees to observe all valid rules and regulations of the utility companies and the sewer authority supplying the Premises with electricity, gas, water and use of sewer, and Tenant shall promptly pay bills for the same during the Lease term.
- 7. Tenant shall return the Premises to Landlord upon the termination of this Lease in the same condition as when taken, reasonable wear and tear excepted, and except for improvements remaining with the Premises as described herein.

Landlord shall be responsible for the transfer of all bills for electricity, gas, water and sewer into Tenant's name as of the date this Lease commences, at which time Tenant's obligation to pay the same shall begin.

Landlord shall be responsible for capital improvements, repairs and maintenance for the Premises including, but not limited to, maintenance, repairs, and replacement as necessary of the HVAC system, electrical wiring, roof, parking area, exterior walls and structural foundation, and plumbing with the exception of plugged drains and toilets.
- 10. If Tenant fails to pay rent when due, or to perform any term of this Lease, after not less than thirty (30) days' written notice of default given to Tenant in the manner set forth in this Lease, Landlord, at Landlord's option, may terminate all rights of Tenant under this Lease, unless Tenant, within the time specified, cures the default. Notice of any change in address shall be given as set forth in this Paragraph.
- 19. Landlord shall have the right to enter the Premises for the purposes of making necessary or agreed repairs and for showing the Premises to prospective tenants, purchasers, or mortgagees, provided that, except in the case of an emergency, such entry shall be made during normal business hours and upon at least thirty-six (36) hours' prior notice to Tenant. Tenant may not change the locks to the Leased Premises without the prior consent of Landlord, and Landlord shall be provided by Tenant with a working key to the locks if the change is allowed.




Exhibit "A" Map of Premises
