<u>Criminal Justice Administration (CJA) 1004 Defensive Tactics and Weaponless Defense (1.5 Units)</u> [Formerly Criminal Justice Administration 60; Police Science 60]

Prerequisite: This class is restricted to those individuals that are currently employed in the criminal justice system.

Total Hours: 24 hours lecture

Catalog Description: This course is designed to provide corrections officers, first line supervisors, and probation officers with advanced skills in the area of weaponless self-defense through refreshment and enhancement of skills developed in the Basic Core Courses. This course includes the application of handcuffing techniques. Strenuous physical activity is involved.

Course Objectives:

By the end of the course, a successful student will be able to

- 1. Demonstrate the low profile cuffing technique and alternate procedures for resisting inmates to gain control,
- 2. Demonstrate proper searching and cuffing techniques from the standing and prone positions,
- 3. Demonstrate the positions of advantage and escort and the techniques for advancing into control holds and come-a-longs,
- 4. Demonstrate the proper techniques of take downs and control holds,
- 5. Demonstrate take downs and control techniques involving combative inmates,
- 6. Demonstrate foot movement and balance stance, and
- 7. Demonstrate avoiding punches, strikes, and kicks

Course Scope and Content:

Unit V Searching and Cuffing

- B. Takedowns and control of combative inmates

Learning Activities Required Outside of Class:

The students in this class will spend a minimum of 2 hours per week outside of the regular class time doing the following:

- 1. Studying
- 2. Skill practice
- 3. Completing required reading
- 4. Written work

Methods of Instruction:

- 1. Lectures and demonstrations by the instructor
- 2. Classroom discussion of specific problems
- 3. Student participation in skill improvement
- 4. Exercises- small groups or one-on-one instruction of techniques
 - a. Control holds
 - b. Searching
 - c. Cuffing
 - d. Takedowns
 - e. Come-alongs

Methods of Evaluation:

- 1. Students will be tested in accordance with the requirements of STC which may include:
 - a. Written examination (STC approved)
 - b. Performance (Behavior Skills-STC)
