Prerequisite knowledge and skills: Before entering the course, the student should be able to

- 1. identify the skills needed to succeed in a new job,
- 2. identify reasons why one would want to be self-sufficient,
- 3. show an understanding of work place rules,
- 4. show an understanding of employer expectations for new employees,
- 5. evaluate work skills and learning styles through assessment,
- 6. identify importance of taking initiative at work,
- 7. identify negative work behaviors,
- 8. identify positive work behaviors,
- 9. identify personal information and its importance,
- 10. identify the importance and impact of one's personal care,
- 11. identify safety in the work place and its importance, and
- 12. identify and demonstrate work ethics.

Catalog Description: The second course in this vocational series focuses on identifying skills necessary to become a valued employee, such as identifying interests in relation to work, identifying qualities of a good employee, identifying the value of teamwork, identifying personality strengths and weaknesses, identifying proper interview attire, identifying possible interview questions, and demonstrating appropriate behavior during an interview. Activities include class discussions, simple interviews with classmates, and completions of handouts, checklists, and worksheets.
